## **Confirmation Preparation Requirements**

- 1. Practice your faith regularly by participating in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days.
- 2. Register for Confirmation Preparation on our website www.stlawrence.org/yff/
- 3. Write a letter of Reflection & Intent stating what Confirmation means to you and why you would like to be Confirmed (page 4).
- 4. If you are not a St. Lawrence School student, turn in a copy of your Baptism and First Communion Certificate.
- 5. Attend all sessions on the schedule. Makeup sessions have been scheduled for emergencies. Attendance is required for all sessions, retreats, rehearsal and the Sacrament. If a student cannot attend the retreat, please contact other Parishes to find a retreat date that you can attend. Please contact Marta Montero with the name of the Parish, Religious Education Coordinator name and contact information and the date of the retreat.

The only excused absences are for illness to the degree that a child is kept home from school or a family emergency. A teen who has excessive absences will need to wait until the following year to celebrate the Sacrament. Scheduling conflicts such as sporting events, practices, or other extracurricular activities will NOT be considered and excused absence. Preparation for the Sacrament is expected to take precedence over those other types of activities.

- 6. Select a Sponsor. Your sponsor should be 16 years of age or older who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation and if married, is married in the Catholic Church. Your sponsor should be chosen as a person who can be a role model and mentor. The Sponsor cannot be a parent (pages 10-11).
- 7. Be a good steward. Stewardship in an integral part of the Confirmation journey. Confirmation candidates should be involved in experiences that enable them to use their gifts and talents in service of others. All candidates must complete the Volunteer Opportunities, fill out the appropriate attached forms (pages 6-9).
- 8. Select a Confirmation Saint. We invite you to research Saints and select a Saint whose life is something you would like to emulate. Some ideas to get you started are to look at a Saint who is the patron of something you are passionate about, or has the same/similar name as you, or a Saint whose feast day is the same as your birthday or Baptism date. All Candidates must complete a Saint Essay (page 5).
- 9. To help you build a strong faith life and community with other young Catholics, Confirmation Candidates are asked to be active in a Faith Formation program during the Confirmation journey. This can be a Catholic school, a teen ministry, Bible study or an alternate program approved by the Director of Youth Faith Formation.

- □ Select a Sponsor. Someone 16 years of age or older, who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation and, if married, is married in the Catholic Church. Your sponsor should be chosen as a person who can be a role model and mentor. (The Sponsor cannot be a parent).
- □ Be a good steward. Stewardship is an integral part of the Confirmation journey. Confirmation candidates should be involved in experiences that enable them to use their gifts and talents in service of others. All candidates must complete three Spiritual and three Volunteer Opportunities, fill out the appropriate forms (see attached).
- Select a Confirmation Saint. We invite you to research Saints and select a Saint whose life is something you would like to emulate. Some ideas to get you started are to look at who is the patron of something you are passionate about, a Saint with the same/similar name as you, or a saint whose feast day is your birthday or baptism date. All candidates for Confirmation are to complete a Saint Essay.
- To help you build a strong faith life and community with other young Catholics, Confirmation candidates are asked to be active in a Faith Formation program during the Confirmation journey. This can be Catholic school, Edge, bible study or an alternate program approved by the Director of Faith Formation.

## **Letter of Reflection & Intent**

We ask all Candidates take a few minutes to shut out the distractions of life and prayerfully reflect on what Confirmation means to you.

- 1. Reflect and write about where you are in your faith journey and why you want to be Confirmed.
- 2. How do you want to express your love for our Church after you are Confirmed?
- 3. How can you continue to grow in your faith after you have been Confirmed?
- Or, just be silent and pray, listen to your heart and write what you feel!

Place your letter in a sealed envelope and write your name on the outside of the envelope. All the letters written by the Candidates will be presented at the presentation of the gifts during the Confirmation Mass.

- 5. Why you selected this Saint.
- 6. Why is this Saint important to you.
- 7. What causes you to want to aspire to be like this Saint.

## **Volunteer Opportunities**

Stewardship is an integral part of the Confirmation journey. Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation includes participation in three service projects. As Catholics and as human beings, we are called to live out the call of Confirmation to spread and proclaim the Catholic faith to all corners of the world. As Saint John Paul II said, we are called to be the "salt and light for the world." This faith is shared with and expressed to others not only in our daily lives of prayer and virtue, but also in the way we love those around us through our actions, our service. Our commitment to bringing the light of the Gospel to people through all we do.

**Candidates should offer a total of 10 or more hours of volunteer service.** St. Lawrence has several opportunities but Candidates can also participate in non-parish sponsored events as long as it is a \*Corporal Work of Mercy. One volunteer opportunity must be completed at St. Lawrence Catholic Church.

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## **Confirmation Sponsor**

The role of the Confirmation sponsor is rooted in the 2,000 year history of the Church. Sponsors are called to be representatives of the Church. The sponsor for a Confirmation candidate is meant to provide spiritual help to the candidate (Catechism 1311). He or she should be willing to serve as a strong and lasting Christian influence on the candidate. A sponsor should be someone the Candidate trusts, whose faith they admire and someone who is accessible to the Candidate. Therefore, it is both a great blessing and a responsibility to commit to the role of a sponsor.

A sponsor takes on a life-long commitment to help their candidate persevere in the Faith. According to the Code of Canon Law (892), "The sponsor is to take care that the confirmed person behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations inherent in this sacrament." The sponsor needs to be a registered member of a Catholic parish in order to get the Sponsor Certificate of Eligibility signed by the pastor.

Your sponsor should be willing and able to participate in your formation for Confirmation. Your sponsor should be someone that you trust and feel comfortable turning to for help, advice and guidance, especially in regard to your spiritual life.

After you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation your relationship with your sponsor DOES NOT END! You both are called to lead each other closer to God, to continue to grow in knowledge of your faith, and to challenge one another to lead lives of holiness and service.

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### **Sponsor Form**

## **Gifts of the Holy Spirit**

**The Gift of Wisdom** is our ability to value spiritual things over worldly ones. It enables us to desire the things of God and correctly order the things in our life. This gift helps us view the world through God's perspective and the light of our faith. It instills a desire to contemplate the things of God.

The Gift of Understanding helps us grasp the truths of the faith more easily and profoundly. Our human intellect cannot grasp all of God's mysteries, but through the gift of understanding we an be lead to truth, even when we do not fully comprehend. This gift strengthen our insight through prayer, scripture and the sacraments.

**The Gift of Right Judgement/Counsel** acknowledges the difference between right and wrong and bestows proper judgement. A person with right judgement avoids sin and leads a life for Christ. Counsel inspires us to speak up and encourage others to do the correct thing. It bestows upon us prudence, allowing us to act promptly and rightly in the face of difficult situations.

**The Gift of Courage/Fortitude** sustains our decision to follow the will of God in any situation. It allows us to stand up and defend our faith, even when threatened by bodily injury of death. This gift allows us to be steadfast in our decisions to do well and to endure evil even when we do not want to.

**The Gift of Knowledge** is awareness of God's plan. It is not simply an accumulation of facts, but rather an understanding of God's purpose and how we ought to respond. Knowledge helps bring to light the temptations that we face, and to discern whether to give in or live a life worthy of God's approval.

**The Gift of Piety** or reverence is our obedience to God and our willingness to serve him. It is not just obedience through a sense of duty or obligation, but rather obedience out of love and devotion. It facilitates a deeper respect and honor for God and His Church.

**The Gift of Wonder and Awe/Fear of the Lord** makes us aware of the glory and majesty of God. This gift is also synonymous with the "Fear of the Lord," in which we dread sin and fear offending God. We fear displeasing him and losing our connection with him because of our love for him. Wonder and awe increases our desire to draw closer to God and depart from sin.
