Confirmation Preparation Requirements

- 1. Practice your faith regularly by participating in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days.
- 2. Register for Confirmation Preparation on our website www.stlawrence.org/yff/.
- 3. Write a letter to the Pastor of St. Lawrence stating why you would like to be Confirmed. See instructions in the packets pertaining to the letter (see page 3).
- 4. Provide a copy of your Baptism and First Communion certificate via email to mmontero@stlawrence.org or drop off a copy at the Parish Office by November 5, 2025. **Please do not give us your original certificate.**
- 5. Attend all sessions on the schedule. Makeup sessions have been scheduled for emergencies. Attendance is required for all sessions, retreats, rehearsal and the Sacrament. If a student cannot attend the retreat, please contact Parishes to find a retreat date that you can attend. Please contact Marta Montero with the name of the Parish, religious education coordinator name and contact information and the date of the retreat. (The only excused absences are for illness to the degree that a child is kept home from school or a family emergency.) A teen who has excessive absences will need to wait until the following year to celebrate the Sacrament. Scheduling conflicts such as sporting events, practices, or other extracurricular activities will NOT be considered and excused absence. Preparation for the Sacrament is expected to take precedence over those other types of activities.)
- 6. Select a Sponsor. Your sponsor should be 16 years of age or older who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation and if married, is married in the Catholic Church. Your sponsor should be chosen as a person who can be a role model and mentor. The Sponsor cannot be a parent (page 9).
- 7. Be a good steward. Stewardship in an integral part of the Confirmation journey. Confirmation candidates should be involved in experiences that enable them to use their gifts and talents in service of others. All candidates must complete the attached Volunteer Opportunities forms (page 5-8).
- 8. Select a Confirmation Saint Name. We invite you to research Saints and select a Saint whose life is something you would like to emulate. Some ideas to get you started are to look at a Saint who is the patron of something you are passionate about, or has the same/similar name as you, or a Saint whose feast day is the same as your birthday or Baptism date. All Candidates must complete a Saint Essay (page 4).
- 9. To help you build a strong faith life and community with other young Catholics, Confirmation Candidates are asked to be active in a Faith Formation program during the Confirmation journey. This can be at a Catholic school, Sunday faith formation classes, a teen ministry, Bible study or an alternate program approved by the Director of Youth Faith Formation.





Letter of Commitment & Intent

We ask all Candidates to write a letter of commitment and intent to the Pastor of St. Lawrence, Fr. Chuck Dornquast. This letter should state your desire to be Confirmed in the Catholic faith and should be approximately one page in length (2-3 paragraphs).

REMEMBER TO INCLUDE YOUR NAME!

Below are some ideas about what to include in your letter:

- 1. Introduce yourself to the Pastor and tell him a few things about yourself, your family, your interests.
- 2. Explain where you are currently in your faith journey. What does your faith mean to you? What does it mean to you to be Catholic?
- 3. What role does God and your faith in God play in your everyday life?
- 4. What does being confirmed mean to you? Detail 2-3 reasons why you would like to be Confirmed.
- 5. Why is this Saint you chose for your Saint name important to you?
- 6. How will you participate in our parish community after your receive the sacrament of Confirmation?
- 7. How do you plan to continue your commitment to the Catholic Church under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to help you keep your faith real and alive in the future?

Write as best you can! This is not being graded or shown to anyone else. This is your opportunity to let Fr. Chuck know about why you are an awesome Confirmandi!

Essays must be typed, placed in an envelope with your name on the outside and turned in no later than February 4, 2026.







Saint Essay

It's true. It's hard to strive for holiness. But we are called to try. Choose a Saint who can inspire you in your spiritual and physical life. Choose the name of a Saint who has the virtues, qualities, and characteristics that you want to emulate. By doing that, you claim that identity for yourself and will have the spiritual support and intercession of that patron Saint!

ALL PROJECTS MUST INCLUDE:

- 1. Your name.
- 2. Name of the Saint you have chosen.
- 3. A brief description of the life of your Saint.
- 4. The feast day of your Saint.
- 5. Why you selected this Saint.
- 6. Why is this Saint important to you.
- 7. What causes you to want to aspire to be like this Saint.

Volunteer Opportunities

Stewardship is an integral part of the Confirmation journey. Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation includes participation in three service projects. As Catholics and as human beings, we are called to live out the call of Confirmation to spread and proclaim the Catholic faith to all corners of the world. As Saint John Paul II said, we are called to be the "salt and light for the world." This faith is shared with and expressed to others not only in our daily lives of prayer and virtue, but also in the way we love those around us through our actions, our service. Our commitment to bringing the light of the Gospel to people through all we do.

Candidates should serve at each of their volunteer opportunities for 4 or more hours. St. Lawrence has several opportunities but Candidates can also participate in non-parish sponsored events as long as it is a *Corporal Work of Mercy. One volunteer opportunity must be completed at St. Lawrence Catholic Church.

Confirmation Sponsor

The role of the Confirmation sponsor is rooted in the 2,000 year history of the Church. Sponsors are called to be representatives of the Church. The sponsor for a Confirmation candidate is meant to provide spiritual help to the candidate (Catechism 1311). He or she should be willing to serve as a strong and lasting Christian influence on the candidate. A sponsor should be someone the Candidate trusts, whose faith they admire and someone who is accessible to the Candidate. Therefore, it is both a great blessing and a responsibility to commit to the role of a sponsor.

A sponsor takes on a life-long commitment to help their candidate persevere in the Faith. According to the Code of Canon Law (892), "The sponsor is to take care that the confirmed person behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations inherent in this sacrament." The sponsor needs to be a registered member of a Catholic parish in order to get the Sponsor Certificate of Eligibility signed by the pastor.

Your sponsor should be willing and able to participate in your formation for Confirmation. Your sponsor should be someone that you trust and feel comfortable turning to for help, advice and guidance, especially in regard to your spiritual life.

After you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation your relationship with your sponsor DOES NOT END! You both are called to lead each other closer to God, to continue to grow in knowledge of your faith, and to challenge one another to lead lives of holiness and service.

Sponsor Form

You have been asked to be a sponsor for the sacrament of Confirmation. A sponsor is a person who assumed, along with the parents, the responsibility for the Candidate's faith. The purpose is to ensure that the rich and beautiful faith of the Church is passed on to them in the most loving and authentic way. In accepting this very important role, you are urged to reflect upon the importance of this commitment. Please read the following and pray about the responsibility you will fulfill in the person's spiritual life. After reflection, please complete all the following, sign the statement of eligibility, and have your Parish sign and seal the bottom portion. A parent may not serve as a sponsor (Canon Law #874). **Due December 3, 2025.**

Gifts of the Holy Spirit



The Gift of Wisdom is our ability to value spiritual things over worldly ones. It enables us to desire the things of God and correctly order the things in our life. This gift helps us view the world through God's perspective and the light of our faith. It instills a desire to contemplate the things of God.



The Gift of Understanding helps us grasp the truths of the faith more easily and profoundly. Our human intellect cannot grasp all of God's mysteries, but through the gift of understanding we an be lead to truth, even when we do not fully comprehend. This gift strengthen our insight through prayer, scripture and the sacraments.



The Gift of Right Judgement/Counsel acknowledges the difference between right and wrong and bestows proper judgement. A person with right judgement avoids sin and leads a life for Christ. Counsel inspires us to speak up and encourage others to do the correct thing. It bestows upon us prudence, allowing us to act promptly and rightly in the face of difficult situations.



The Gift of Courage/Fortitude sustains our decision to follow the will of God in any situation. It allows us to stand up and defend our faith, even when threatened by bodily injury of death. This gift allows us to be steadfast in our decisions to do well and to endure evil even when we do not want to.



The Gift of Knowledge is awareness of God's plan. It is not simply an accumulation of facts, but rather an understanding of God's purpose and how we ought to respond. Knowledge helps bring to light the temptations that we face, and to discern whether to give in or live a life worthy of God's approval.



The Gift of Piety or reverence is our obedience to God and our willingness to serve him. It is not just obedience through a sense of duty or obligation, but rather obedience out of love and devotion. It facilitates a deeper respect and honor for God and His Church.



The Gift of Wonder and Awe/Fear of the Lord makes us aware of the glory and majesty of God. This gift is also synonymous with the "Fear of the Lord," in which we dread sin and fear offending God. We fear displeasing him and losing our connection with him because of our love for him. Wonder and awe increases our desire to draw closer to God and depart from sin.
